Rhoeo Hawaiian Dwarf

THE YARD— FEBRUARY GARDENING

- Vegetables to sow—spring onions and Chinese cabbage
- Flowers to sow—Cornflowers
- Prune in February—You can prune hydrangeas now, or wait until the depths of winter. Pruning at this time of year gives the plant more time to develop next season's flowering wood
- Pest Watch—Two-spotted mites cause bronze discoloration of leaves and, if an infestation is severe, fine webbing covers the leaves. Plants in dry spots are particularly susceptible, and beans are favorites
